111-2. Beginning French (3) 111—F; 112—S

111—F: This course is designed for students with no previous knowledge of French. It covers the basic grammar and vocabulary of the language, including the present and past tenses of the verb, and the use of pronouns and prepositions. Students will also learn to understand and use simple written and spoken French.

211. Intermediate Conversation and Grammar (3)

Every Fourth Semester

This course focuses on developing students' conversational skills and understanding of French grammar. It covers the present and past tenses of the verb, and the use of pronouns and prepositions. Students will also learn to understand and use simple written and spoken French.

212. Composition and Grammar (3) Every Fourth Semester

This course focuses on developing students' writing skills and understanding of French grammar. It covers the present and past tenses of the verb, and the use of pronouns and prepositions. Students will also learn to understand and use simple written and spoken French.

213. Introduction to Francophone Cultures (3) Every Fourth Semester

This course introduces students to the diverse cultures of the Francophone world. It covers the history, geography, and social customs of various French-speaking countries and regions. Students will also learn to understand and use simple written and spoken French.

214. Readings in Literature and Culture (3) Every Fourth Semester

This course focuses on reading and analyzing French literature and culture. It covers the history, geography, and social customs of various French-speaking countries and regions. Students will also learn to understand and use simple written and spoken French.
