## Employer Tuition Reimbursement

Employer tuition reimbursement programs are designed to help employees pay for their education. The amount of reimbursement is typically limited to a certain percentage of the employee's salary and is often subject to a maximum dollar amount per year.

Employer tuition reimbursement programs are typically subject to the following requirements:

1. The employee must be employed by the employer for a certain period of time before becoming eligible for the program.

4. The employee must be enrolled in an approved educational program.

## Acceptance Deposits

Acceptance deposits are typically required for students who are accepted into a program but have not yet started classes. The amount of the deposit is typically a percentage of the total cost of the program.
