Appeal Procedures

1. The student must file a written appeal with the Registrar's Office within 10 business days of the date of the original decision. The appeal must include a copy of the original decision and a statement of the student's reasons for appealing the decision.

2. The Registrar's Office will review the appeal and may request additional information from the student. The Registrar's Office will then forward the appeal to the appropriate academic body for review.

3. The academic body will review the appeal and make a decision. The student will be notified of the decision in writing.

4. If the student is not satisfied with the decision, they may file a further appeal with the Registrar's Office within 10 business days of the date of the decision.

Academic Grievance

1. An academic grievance is a complaint by a student regarding an academic decision made by a faculty member. The student must file a written grievance with the Registrar's Office within 10 business days of the date of the decision.

2. The Registrar's Office will review the grievance and may request additional information from the student. The Registrar's Office will then forward the grievance to the appropriate academic body for review.

3. The academic body will review the grievance and make a decision. The student will be notified of the decision in writing.

4. If the student is not satisfied with the decision, they may file a further grievance with the Registrar's Office within 10 business days of the date of the decision.

Admission Information

General Admission Requirements

1. Applicants must be at least 18 years old at the time of admission.

2. Applicants must have completed a high school diploma or equivalent.

3. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.

4. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 12 college credits.

5. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 30 semester hours of college credit.

Additional Admission Requirements for International Students

1. International students must provide proof of financial resources to cover the cost of tuition and living expenses.

2. International students must provide proof of English language proficiency.

3. International students must provide proof of a valid passport and visa.

4. International students must provide proof of a minimum of 30 semester hours of college credit.
